

NOTICE is hereby given that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor-in-Council for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act" incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

(d) Subject to the provisions of the said Act, to sell, convey, mortgage, or hypothecate, any of the property herein mentioned for the purpose of the said Company and to do all things necessary or incidental thereto.

(e) To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise and to own and hold real and personal property as may be deemed necessary for the above carrying on of the business of the Company and the same to sell, mortgage, lease, let, hire, pledge, or otherwise encumber or part with including here-with power to sell, lease or encumber the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof or any interest therein.

(f) To acquire by original application, purchase or otherwise any trade mark, formulae, trade processes, trade names and description marks in connection with the business of the Company.

(g) To open agencies, employ agents, erect buildings and carry on branch stores for the manufacturing of and sale of any of the products of goods of the said Company in whatsoever centres are deemed advisable.

(h) The head office or chief place of business of the Company is to be in the Town of Grand Falls in the County of Victoria in the aforesaid Province of New Brunswick.
