

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC** Notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Twenty-fifth day of March, A. D. 1910, incorporating James S. Neill, Merchant; John Neill, Merchant; J. Stewart Neill, Merchant; Mary T. Neill, Married Woman; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, and Province of New Brunswick; and Albert B. Neill, of the Parish of Saint Mary's, in the County aforesaid, Farmer, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire, take over and continue as a going concern the business, good-will, undertaking, plant, machinery, stock-in-trade, book debts, books of account, choses in action, assets of the wholesale and retail hardware and manufacturing business at present carried on by James S. Neill, Esquire, at the City of Fredericton and elsewhere within the Province of New Brunswick, together with the real estate, personal property, machinery, effects and other assets of the said business; and to carry on and conduct the business of manufacturing of iron and steel works, smelting and casting, and to buy, sell and manufacture all classes of metal and the products thereof; and to manufacture, buy, sell and supply all kinds of machinery and iron and steel supplies and any other article made from any kind of wood or metal; and to carry on a general business of buying and selling as hardware merchants or otherwise; and to import and sell iron, steel, brass, silver, copper and all other kinds of metals and the products thereof, and all articles made therefrom, and any other class or classes of general merchandise of every nature, kind and description.

To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire and to hold, own, use, operate, sell, assign or otherwise dispose of, to grant licenses in respect of or otherwise turn to account any and all inventions, patents, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured by the Letters Patent of Canada or any other country.

To have, hold, acquire, mortgage, purchase, lease, and hypothecate real and personal property of every nature, kind and description including bonds and stocks of any incorporated Company; and to take over, acquire, have and hold security upon any real estate or personal property or effects whatsoever.

To buy and sell at wholesale and retail all kinds of hardware or wooden products, goods and merchandise of every nature, kind or description, and to do all such things as are incidental or pertinent to a general wholesale and retail hardware business.

To acquire and purchase stock-in-trade, real and personal property, franchises, patents, patent rights, licenses and effects and estates of any person or persons or incorporated Company or Companies now or hereafter carrying on any similar business, or to take security thereon and to continue the same when so acquired and to sell and dispose of the same when so acquired and any and every part thereof.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being carried on in connection with the above named objects or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of properties, franchises, assets and credits of the Company.
