NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC Notice is hereby given that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Third day of August, A. D. 1910, incorporating Stanley E. Elkin, Manufacturer, William A. Johnston, Painter, A. E. Louis Phillips, Tobacconist, Milton C. Macdonald, Machinist, and Robert L. Johnston, Broker, all of the City of Saint John in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To establish automobile garages in the City of Saint John and elsewhere in the Province of New Brunswick, and to maintain and run the same.

NOTICE OF ASSIGNMENT AND MEETING OF CREDITORS

TAKE notice that Horace S. Godard and Frederick W.
