

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Twenty-second day of February, A. D. 1910, incorporating Walter Samuel Davidson, Manager; George Herbert Perry, Manager; W. Sanford Smith, Merchant; Leander S. Peppard, Commission Merchant; and Clifford W. Robinson, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, own, produce and present and to license others to produce and present theatrical plays and Operas; and to acquire, hold, sell, assign and transfer copyrights and copyrighted plays and operas.

To purchase, build, lease or otherwise acquire, own, operate, control and manage, and to sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of theatres, playhouses, music halls, or other places of music, and to give public or private performances of any kind therein or go anywhere else; and for such purposes to hire and engage performers, singers and all other persons and help required therefor.

To show, exhibit and operate either free of charge or upon the deposit or payment of a nominal sum of money various mirth-provoking novelties and devices and divers machines presenting scenic and other still and animated views and discoursing music and song, etc.

To hold, buy, lease, purchase or otherwise acquire, all movable and immovable property required for the operation of the Company; to sell or lease the same in whole or in part; to replace or exchange it and to hypothecate its immovable property or any part thereof as occasion may arise. To buy, import, make or manufacture the machinery, machines, devices and novelties which may be used by the said Company in its business and any other objects or articles pertaining thereto or incidentally connected therewith and to sell, lease, exchange or otherwise dispose of or hypothecate such machinery, machines, devices and novelties.

For the purposes of the Company to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, hold, own and control and to sell, convey, mortgage, pledge, lease or otherwise dispose of real estate, lands and buildings of all kinds and to construct buildings thereon.

To purchase and otherwise acquire, hold, own and dispose of or hypothecate, bonds, mortgages, shares in stock and other securities and obligations, contracts and evidences of indebtedness of any other person or corporation, public, private or municipal, and generally to exercise in respect to the same all the rights, powers and privileges of individual ownership thereof including the right to vote upon such shares of stock.

To sell and dispose of the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit and to accept in exchange for the same shares, debentures or securities of any other Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.

To act as agents for other persons, companies and firms doing a similar business.

To buy the assets of any person or Company carrying on a business similar to that which this business is authorized to carry on or to amalgamate with said person or Company to lease their rights, issue shares and debentures and do all things necessary or conducive to the purposes above mentioned and to exercise all powers required for that object; and to pay for any of the above mentioned property and for services rendered in connection therewith by the issue of fully paid up and non-assessable stock of the Company.

To manufacture, develop and control for the purposes of the Company electricity or gas for light, heat and power purposes and for such purposes to erect, install and equip such machinery or apparatus necessary or requisite, subject to all Provincial and Municipal laws and regulations with regard to the same.

To carry on and conduct the business of the Company above set forth in all its various branches and generally to do anything and everything which may be found necessary or desirable to promote the objects for which the Company has been formed; by the name of "The Enterprise Amusement Company, Limited," with a total Capital Stock of Forty thousand dollars divided into Four hundred shares of One hundred dollars each, and with its head office at the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland.
