PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the obsequies of His Late Majesty, King Edward the Seventh, of Blessed Memory, will take place on Friday the Twentieth day of May, instant;

I do therefore hereby proclaim the said Twentieth day of May instant, to be a Public Holiday, and a day of general mourning to be observed by all persons throughout our Province of New Brunswick.

Given under my hand and seal, at Fredericton, the Thirteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten and in the First year of His Majesty's Reign.

HIS Honour the Lieutenant-Governor has received through His Excellency the Governor-General the following cablegram:

"May 11th, 1910."

"Court mourning will last until May 6th, 1911. It is expected that the public will wear decent mourning from May Twelfth, duration not fixed. King Edward's funeral will take place on morning of May Twentieth."
