

NOTICE is hereby given that the persons hereinafter mentioned will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for the Grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act."

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is to be "Edward Partington Pulp & Paper Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To carry on and operate the business of the manufacture of all kinds of Pulp and Paper and products thereof from wood or any other material, and for carrying on and operating a general lumbering and saw milling business in all its branches, including logging, driving, ponding, storing, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of logs and timber, and all kinds and classes of lumber manufactured and unmanufactured, and buying, selling and dealing in logs, timber, and pulp and paper and all products and by-products thereof; and to purchase or lease or acquire, hold, operate and develop any and all lands and tenements, ground permits, licenses, lumber rights, lumber limits, driving rights, ponding rights, water power, mills, mill privileges and mill buildings; and to erect and build wharves, dams, brows, piers, bridges, steamboats, tugs scows and vessels of every kind.

(b) To purchase and acquire and take over as a going concern the business now carried on by Edward Partington at Union Point in the Parish of Lancaster in the City and County of Saint John, together with the pulp mills, buildings, wharves, machinery, real estate, lands and premises, property and effects of every nature, kind and description in connection with the said business at Union Point aforesaid, and for the carrying on and conducting at Union Point aforesaid of the business of pulp and paper makers in the making of pulp and paper from wood and all other materials from which the same can be made, and for manufacturing any article or materials which can be made out of the said pulp or paper, and for buying, selling and dealing in all kinds of lumber, wood, and materials of every kind in connection with the said business, and for manufacturing, importing, buying and selling all articles of every kind and description which enter into the manufacture of pulp and paper, or the products thereof, or which can be made or manufactured thereout or in connection therewith.

(c) To purchase, take over and acquire all the saw mills, pulp mills, lumber mills, real estate, lands, buildings, wharves, property and effects of every nature and kind known as "The Cushing Mill Property" owned by the said Edward Partington at Union Point aforesaid, and for carrying on and conducting all the business of sawing and manufacturing of lumber, timber and wood of all kinds, and the manufacturing of all articles made of wood or capable of being made of or out of wood, and importing, buying and selling and dealing in generally of all articles of every kind and description made or capable of being made out of wood or any of the products thereof or which can be manufactured in connection therewith.

(d) To construct, make, manufacture, purchase, lease, hire, charter, or otherwise acquire or possess and to own, and hold and operate tramways, motors, barges, scows, boats, dredges, tug boats, sail vessels and steamers and other conveyances plant and appliances by land or water, and all machinery, implements, erections, plant, goods, chattels and effects necessary or convenient for or incidental to the purposes of the company or any of them; and to carry on the business of dredging also of bargemen, scowmen and common carriers of lumber, goods, wares and merchandize and such other articles as may be convenient for or incidental to or capable of being conveniently carried on with the business of the Company or in connection therewith.

(e) To carry on and conduct the business of machinists and foundrymen, and to cast, make, manufacture and construct all and any implements, machines, tools and appliances of every kind in brass, iron, copper, steel or other metals, and to buy, sell, and deal in machines, machinery, implements and tools and all articles manufactured from iron, brass, steel, copper or other metals or the products thereof.

(f) To carry on a general mercantile business.

(g) To manufacture or generate electricity for the purpose of electric light, power or heat, and to sell and supply and distribute the same to others upon such terms as the said company may deem expedient.

(h) To acquire, have and hold lumber lands, licenses and leases to cut lumber, boom rights, water privileges and real and personal estate of all kinds, including bonds and stocks of any incorporated company, and to sell and assign, lease or dispose of the same, and to take, acquire, have and hold security upon any real or personal effects whatsoever.

(i) To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire and to hold, own, use or operate, and to sell, assign, lease or otherwise dispose of, or grant licenses in respect to, or otherwise turn to account any and all inventions, patents, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured under or by virtue of any letters patent of Canada or any other country.

(j) To borrow or raise money on behalf of the Company.

3. The head office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at the Parish of Lancaster in the City and County of Saint John in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of Capital Stock of the proposed Company is Nine hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$950,000.)

5. The said Capital Stock is to be divided into Nine thousand five hundred (9,500) shares of One hundred dollars each.
