## Condensed Rules Respecting Notices for Private Bills.

**A**LL applications to Parliament for Private Bills shall be advertised by a notice in the Canada Gazette clearly and distinctly stating the nature and objects of the application and signed by or on behalf of the applicants with the address of the party signing the same. For an Act of Incorporation the name of the proposed Company shall be stated. If the works of any company are to be declared to be for the general advantage of Canada, the same shall be specifically mentioned in the notice and a copy of such notice shall be sent by registered letter to the clerk of each county or municipality which may be specially affected by such works and also to the secretary of the province in which such works are or may be located; and proof of such service of notice shall be established by statutory declaration.

In addition to the notice in the Canada Gazette aforesaid, a similar notice shall be published in some leading newspaper, as follows:

1. For Acts of Incorporation—(a) Of a railway or canal company, or of a company for the construction of any special works, or for obtaining any special rights and privileges: In the principal place in each county or district affected:

(b) Of a telegraph or telephone company: In the principal place in each province in which the company intends to operate.

(c) Of banks, insurance, trust, loan or industrial companies, (without any special powers): Advertise in the Canada Gazette only.

2. For amendments to Acts of Incorporation— (a) For the extension of a line of railway or canal or branches there-to: In the principal place in each county affected;

(b) For the revival or continuation of a charter or for extension of time for the construction of works of any kind, or for the enlargement of any of the powers of a company (not involving additional special powers): At the head office of the company;

(c) For the granting of any special powers or privileges: In the localities actually affected.

All such notices shall be published at least once a week for five consecutive weeks; and in Quebec and Manitoba shall be published in both English and French; and if there be no newspaper published in the locality affected, such notice shall be given in the next nearest locality wherein a newspaper is published. Proof of publication shall be established in each case by statutory declaration to be sent to the Clerk of the House.

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**N**OTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a Grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the Provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amending Acts, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes following:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Menzies Construction Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are: To own and operate quarries, brick yards and lime kilns, and to manufacture brick, to burn lime, and to supply building and construction materials, of all descriptions.

To construct, purchase, lease or acquire and maintain any plants, buildings, works, factories, mills and machinery that may be necessary or useful to the undertakings of the Company.

To purchase, lease or hold lands in fee simple, or otherwise including license of Crown Lands, with power to sell, mortgage, lease and dispose of the same.

To purchase, hire, construct or manufacture, for use in connection with the business of the Company, any and all kinds of chattels and personal property suitable to or for the business of the Company.

To purchase, acquire, hold, use, sell, transfer, mortgage, pledge and dispose of all kinds of personal property and merchandise.

To borrow money for the needs of the Company, and to mortgage, pledge or hypothecate any or all assets of the Company, real or personal, in security for loans made to the Company.

To establish and maintain booms, piers, wharves and such other conveniences as are suitable to the protection of shipment of logs, lumber or other commodities dealt in by the Company, providing the same do not obstruct navigation of any stream or river.

To operate any of the works of the Company by water, steam, electricity, compressed air, or any other motive power, and generally to equip, maintain and use plants in connection with their business producing steam, electricity or compressed air, and by means thereof to supply heat, light or power to other persons or corporations.

To build, construct, man, equip, maintain, acquire, dispose of, own, manage, operate, hire, and charter lighters, barges, ships, steamers, tugboats, dredges, and dredging outfits and requisites, and vessels of every description, and generally to do all things incidental or necessary to the same.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

3. The office and principal place of business of the Company is to be at Prince of Wales, in the Parish of Musquash, aforesaid, or at such place in the Province of New Brunswick as the directors may from time to time decide.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the company is to

be Forty-nine Thousand Dollars, to be divided into nine hundred and eighty shares of fifty dollars each.
