Hickman together with the good will thereof, and the acquiring and operating the mills, lands and properties now owned or held by them for the purposes of such business; and the acquiring and using, according to the nature thereof, all the property and assets of said firm and business.

(b) To acquire, lease, purchase, sell alienate and hold permanent and portable mills, properties, mill sites and water powers and other mill privileges, timber, lumber lands in fee or otherwise, growing timber and timber and lumber berths, limits, licenses and privileges, and all such other lands, if any, as may be needed for the purposes of such business or other incidental purposes.

(c) The managing and operating such mills and timber and other lands, limits, licenses and privileges, or any of them, according to the nature thereof.
