

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under Chapter Eighty Five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Eighth day of April, A. D. 1910, incorporating John Howard Hickman, Merchant; Charles Smith Hickman, Lumberman; Teresa Hickman, Married Woman; Frances Mary Charlotte Hickman, Married Woman, all of Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; and Joseph Avard, of Port Elgin, in said County and Province, Clerk, for the following purposes, namely:

The acquiring and taking over as a going concern the lumbering, milling, mercantile and other business heretofore carried on by the Applicants John H. Hickman and Charles S. Hickman, by and under the firm name and style of J. & C. Hickman together with the good will thereof, and the acquiring and operating the mills, lands and properties now owned or held by them for the purposes of such business; and the acquiring and using, according to the nature thereof, all the property and assets of said firm and business.

To acquire, lease, purchase, sell alienate and hold permanent and portable mills, properties, mill sites and water powers and other mill privileges, timber, lumber lands in fee or otherwise, growing timber and timber and lumber berths, limits, licenses and privileges, and all such other lands, if any, as may be needed for the purposes of such business or other incidental purposes.

The managing and operating such mills and timber and other lands, limits, licenses and privileges, or any of them, according to the nature thereof.

The acquiring of booming and log driving rights, easements and privileges for or in connection with said business; and the acquiring and holding of shares in any boom or log driving company operating near said lands and now or hereafter incorporated.

Sawing and manufacturing of lumber and other wood goods.

The buying, selling, shipping and dealing in timber, lumber and other wood goods.

The buying and selling of corn, wheat and other grains and cereals, and the grinding and manufacturing the same and selling the product thereof, and the operation of a general flour, grain and milling business.

The acquiring of farms and carrying on the business of farming.

To conduct and carry on a general merchandise business, wholesale or retail or both, and the buying and selling of goods, wares and merchandize of every kind and description.

For the purpose and to the extent necessary for the transport of the timber, lumber, grain and other articles manufactured by the company, and the goods and merchandize referred to in last clause preceding this, to acquire, build and charter, sail and use ships, steam tugs, schooners, barges, lighters and other vessels, and when not required for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, to hire or make use of the same in such manner as to the Company seems expedient, and to sell or alienate the same at pleasure.

To do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the carrying on of said businesses or the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Company either as carrying on said business or as holders of or as interested in any property or otherwise.

The Company hereby incorporated shall be liable for the debts and obligations of the said J. & C. Hickman existing at the time of taking over the said property, and may be sued for the same in any Court of competent jurisdiction, by the name of "J. & C. Hickman, Limited," with a total capital stock of One hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into Fifteen hundred shares of One hundred dollars each, and with the head office of the said Company at Port Elgin, in the Parish of Westmorland in the County of Westmorland.

NOTICE OF ASSIGNMENT, OF MEETING OF CREDITORS, AND TO FILE CLAIMS.
