NOTICE is hereby given that within one month after the last publication of this Notice in the Royal Gazette, application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes herein mentioned.
