

NOTICE OF SHERIFF'S SALE.

NOTICE is hereby given, unto all to whom it doth or may concern: That there will be sold at public auction, at the Court House in the Town of Edmundston in the County of Madawaska, on Wednesday, the fifteenth day of June next, A. D. 1910, at the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon, all the estate, right, title and interest, both at law and in Equity, of The Edmundston Trotting Park and Exhibition Association, Limited, in the following described lands and premises, that is to say: All that lot, piece or parcel of land described as follows: Beginning at a point thirty-three feet from the centre of the highway road, on the line fence dividing lands owned by Richard H. NOTICE is hereby given that the persons hereinafter named will apply under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and amending Acts for Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name of "The Turnbull-Munroe Company, Limited."
