LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER,

FREDERICTON, THURSDAY, March 7, 1892.

THIS day, at ten o'clock, His Honor the Honorable SIR SAMUEL LEONARD TILLEY, C.B., K.C.M.G. LL.D., Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Council Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, commanded the attendance of the House of Assembly, who being come, His Honor, after assenting to the several Bills passed during the Session, was pleased to close the Session with the following

S P E E C H :

*" Mr. President, and Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
" Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,*

" You have my thanks for the zeal and energy with which you have devoted yourselves to the general business of the Session, and to those subjects to which I have from time to time invited your attention.

" I trust that the several measures submitted to your consideration have, through your wisdom and experience, been disposed of in a way conducive to the best interests of our people:
