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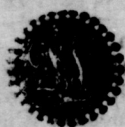

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Letters Patent Act" and Amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the eighteenth day of January, A. D. 1892, incorporating Howard D. Troop, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Jacob V. Troop, of the same place, Merchant; Charles M. L. Troop, of the same place, Clerk; John E. Irvine, of the same place, Merchant; and John S. Zebley, of the City of New York, in the State of New York, one of the United States of America, Banker; Samuel Hayward, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Joseph Bullock, of the same place, Merchant; Clement P. Clarke, of the same place, Druggist; George W. Jones, of the same place, Brewer; Charles H. Dearborn, of the same place, Merchant; Joseph F. Merritt, of the same place, Merchant; W. Watson Allen, of the same place, Barrister-at-Law; and George K. McLeod, of the same place, Lumber Merchant; for the following purposes, namely:—To acquire stock or shares in "The Eastern Electric Company, (Limited)," "The New Brunswick Electric Company, (Limited)," and "The Saint John City Railway Company," and also the outstanding Bonds or Debentures issued by the said several Companies, and also all rights, privileges, franchises, lighting contracts, assets and property, both real and personal, of the said "The Eastern Electric Company, (Limited)," and "The New Brunswick Electric Company, (Limited)," with power to pay for the said stock, Bonds, rights, privileges, franchises, lighting contracts, assets, and property in the stock and Bonds, or either of them, of "The Consolidated Electric Company, (Limited)";

To purchase, or lease, or otherwise acquire any real or personal property, patents of invention, easements, franchises or privileges, which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business;

To lease, sell, mortgage or otherwise convey and deal with the real or personal property acquired by the Company, and for such purpose to sign, seal, execute and deliver all necessary conveyances, mortgages or other instruments of writing necessary in the premises, with covenants contained in the same;
