

### In the Supreme Court in Equity.

Between Elizabeth M. Kercher and Peter M. Kercher, Plaintiffs; and

Minnie Hudson, Thomas Hudson, Isabella M. Kay, Sarah M. Kercher, Duncan M. Kercher, Margaret Shean, James Shean, Alice Murray, Robert L. Murray, Charles Murray, Mary Ann Duff, and George Duff, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit, to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Minnie Hudson, Thomas Hudson, Duncan M. Kercher, Margaret Shean, and James Shean, five of the above named defendants, do not reside within the said Province of New Brunswick, so that they cannot be served with a Summons, and that their place of residence cannot be ascertained by the plaintiffs, and that the above plaintiffs have good *prima facie* grounds for filing a bill against the above named defendants: I do hereby order, that the said defendants, Minnie Hudson, Thomas Hudson, Duncan M.
