HEREAS the Certificate provided for by Section 14 of Chapter 47, of the Acts of Assembly 49th Victoria, of the Chairman and Secretary of the Board of Firewardens in said Act mentioned, have been filed with the Honorable the Provincial Secretary, together with a copy

By His Honor The Honorable Sir SAMUEL of the proceedings of the hereinafter mentioned Meeting, whereby it appears that said Chairman and Secretery called a Meeting of the Citizens of the Village of Sussex, liable to pay Statute Labor or Road Tax, and resident within the Fire Ward created by said Act, at a time and place and on two weeks' notice, as required by said Act, and that at such Meeting more than three-fourths of the ratepayers present did by vote approve of Sections two, three, four, five, and eight, of said Act being brought into force, and that all the requirements by said Section 14 of said Act made precedent to the issuing of the hereinafter Proclamation has been complied with.

> Now therefore, I do hereby in and by virtue of the said Act of Assembly, proclaim and declare, and hereby give notice, that Sections two, three, four, five, and eight, of said Act shall be in full force and effect.
