

- IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-beloved Cousin and Councillor Sir JOHN CAMPBELL HAMILTON-GORDON, Earl of Aberdeen, Viscount Formartine, Baron Haddo, Methlic, Tarves and Kellie, in the Peerage of Scotland, Viscount Gordon of Aberdeen, County of Aberdeen, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom, Baronet of Nova Scotia, etc., etc., Governor General of Canada.
- At Our Government House, in Our City of OTTAWA, this TWENTY FIRST day of SEPTEMBER, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, and in the Fifty-seventh year of Our Reign.
