IN THE SUPREME COURT.

In the matter of The Maritime Bank of the Dominion of Canada, and the winding up of the same under the Winding Up Act.

UPON the application of the Liquidators of the above Bank, and upon reading their Petition hereto annexed, the first day of April next is hereby fixed as the day on or before which all holders of Notes of the said Bank, in respect of which claims have not been filed, must file their claims in respect thereof with the said Liquidators at the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick; and I do hereby order, that the amount reserved under Section 103 of the Winding Up Act for payment of such Notes still outstanding, or so much of the amount thereof as shall not have been applied for, do after the said first day of April next, form part of the general fund and be payable, as a part of a last and final dividend to the creditors of the said Bank; and that all holders of such Notes of the said Bank, who shall not file their claims or apply for dividends within the time above limited by this Order, shall be then forever absolutely debarred from all every claim in respect of the said Notes of the said Bank then outstanding; and that all rights or claims in respect of the same shall be then and thereafter disallowed.
