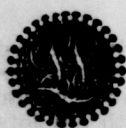

Notice of Granting Letters Patent.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twentieth day of September, A. D. 1893, incorporating Daniel W. Clark, of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, Contractor; Daniel C. Clark, of the same place, Contractor; Charles R. Clark, of the same place, Electrician; William Bruckhof, of the same place, Merchant;

and George F. Calkin, of the same place, Agent, for the following purposes:—To construct, operate and maintain in Carleton, in the City of Saint John, and in Fairville, in the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John, and other adjacent portions of the Parish of Lancaster, all customary and proper works for the manufacture, distribution and sale of Electrical Energy for all purposes for which the same may be employed, and to acquire, by purchase, lease or otherwise, any property, real or personal, electric works, plant, easements, franchises and privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purpose of carrying on its business; and to lease, sell or otherwise convey and deal with the real or personal property acquired by the said Company; to carry on the business of Carpenters, Contractors and Builders, and the acquiring by purchase or otherwise, and selling and delivering of such goods and merchandize as are used in connection with said business, subject to certain conditions in the Letters Patent more particularly defined, by the name of "D. W. CLARK & SONS, (Limited)," with a total capital stock of Twenty two thousand dollars, divided into two hundred and twenty shares of One hundred dollars each.

Escheat of Mining Licenses.

In the matter of two Mining Licenses, between Her Majesty the Queen and Francis Woods and A. Corbett, bearing date the 24th March, A. D. 1870, and between Her Majesty the Queen and T. R. Jones, Dr. W. S. Harding, A. Corbett, and J. H. Harding, bearing date the 21st March, A. D. 1870.

To Francis Woods and others, aforesaid, Lessees of certain Mining Rights within the bounds of certain lots or tracts of land situate in Clones Settlement, in the Parishes of Petersville and Gagetown, County of Queen's, under License from Her Majesty the Queen to above mentioned persons, bearing date the days and year aforesaid, being Licenses Nos. 29 and 30 respectively, and containing one square mile each.
