IN THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Narcisse Marquis, Plaintiff, against

David Chasse and Felix Martin, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Felix Martin, one of the above defendants, does not reside within the Province, so that he cannot be served with Summons, and that his place of residence cannot be ascertained by the plaintiff, and that the above plaintiff has good prima facie grounds for filing a Bill against the above named defendants: I do order, that the said defendant, Felix Martin, on or before the twelfth day of August next, do enter an appearance in this suit, (if he intend to defend the same), wherein a Bill will be filed against the above named defendants by the above named plaintiff, for a Decree of this Honorable Court, setting aside a certain Indenture made between the defendant, David Chasse, of the first part, and the defendant, Felix Martin, of the second part, dated the twenty first day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety two, and registered in the Office of the Registrar of Deeds in and for the County of Madawaska, in Book L, pages 294, 295 and 296, on the fourth day of April, A. D. 1892, on the grounds that the said conveyance was made in fraud of the said plaintiff and for the purpose of hindering, delaying and preventing him from recovering the amount of his judgment obtained by him against the said defendant, David Chasse; and unless such appearance is so entered, the Bill may be taken pro confesso and a Decree made.
