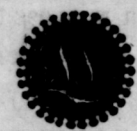

CROWN LAND OFFICE, 3rd May, 1893.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that the following Order was passed in Council on the 18th day of April last:—

"Ordered, That all purchasers of Crown Lands, under the Act to facilitate the settlement of Crown Lands, made prior to the 31st day of December, 1888, and not yet granted, will be cancelled on the 1st day of August next, and the lands again become vacant, unless the parties interested do previously furnish the Office of Crown Lands, with the Certificate of the Labor Act Commissioner that the conditions of payment, (by work or money), improvements and residence, as required by the Third Section of said Act, have been fully complied with."
