## PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Act of Assembly 56th Victoria, Chapter 16, intituled *An Act to provide for the establishment of a Boys' Industrial Home*, made and passed on the fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety three, I do hereby, with the advice of my Executive Council, proclaim and declare that certain Buildings and Lands in connection therewith, forming a portion of the old Penitentiary grounds, in the Parish of Simonds, in the City and County of Saint John, bounded as follows:—Beginning at a point on the eastern side of the road leading from Blakeslee's farm to Little River, where it is intersected by the southwardly boundary line of a lot of land there formerly owned by John Cummings; thence running along the said boundary line north seventy eight degrees east by the magnet fifty chains and thirty four links to a stake; thence at right angles south twelve degrees east six chains and ninety four links to another stake; thence south seventy eight degrees west, parallel with the first named course, fifty eight chains and fifty links, to the eastern line of the road aforesaid; and thence northwardly on the said easterly line of said road, following the courses thereof, to the place of beginning; together with all the erections and enclosures thereon, or on any part thereof, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, and heretofore vested in Her Majesty for the purposes of a Provincial Penitentiary, are hereby established as a Reformatory and Industrial Home for Boys and a Reformatory Prison, by the name of "The Boys' Industrial Home."
