CROWN LAND OFFICE, 18th July, 1894.

THE attention of all holders of Timber Licenses is called to Section 19 of the Timber Regulations which reads as follows:—

"19. No Spruce or Pine Trees shall be cut by any Licensee under any License, not even for piling, which will not make a log at least 18 feet in length and ten inches at the small end; and if any such shall be cut, the Lumber shall be liable to double Stumpage and the License be forfeited."

And all Licensees are hereby notified that for the future the provisions of this Section will be rigidly enforced.

## Notice of Granting Letters Patent

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, A. D. 1894, incorporating Albert Turner Dunn, of Musquash, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Theodore Harding Estabrooks, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province aforesaid, Merchant; Alexander Perley Barnhill, of the said City of Saint John, Barrister-at-Law; and William Bayard, of the same place, Physician; for the following purposes, namely:—

To construct, operate and maintain in the Village of Saint George and adjoining districts, in the County of Charlotte, all customary and proper works for the manufacture distribution and sale of Electrical Energy for all purposes for which the same may be used or employed;

To acquire by purchase, lease, or otherwise, and to use and employ instruments, machinery and apparatus for the production and distribution of Electricity for the purposes of light, heat and power, and all other purposes for which the same may be employed, in the Village of Saint George and adjoining districts, and to construct, acquire and maintain for the purposes aforesaid all necessary and proper buildings and machinery;

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire any real or personal property, patents of invention, easements, franchises or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business;

To lease, sell, transfer, mortgage or otherwise convey and deal with the real and personal property acquired by the Company, and for such purposes to sign, seal, execute and deliver all necessary instruments, with such covenants in the same as to said Company may seem proper;

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire the whole or any part of the property and franchises of, or to amalgamate or enter into any working agreement with any other incorporated Company having authority so to contract, subject to certain conditions in the Letters Patent more particularly defined; by the name of "THE SAINT GEORGE ELECTRIC COMPANY, (Limited)," with a total capital of Five thousand dollars, divided as follows:—

A stock, being the ordinary stock of the Company to the amount of \$2,500, being twenty five shares of One hundred dollars each; and B stock, to the amount of \$2,500, being twenty five shares of \$100 each, being preference stock, having a preference of right to a payment of dividends over ordinary stock at a rate not exceeding seven per cent. annually upon the amount paid up upon the B stock.
