PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the City Clerk of the City of Fredericton did, within thirty days from the eighteenth day of September, A. D. 1894, make a report to The Honorable The Provincial Secretary at Fredericton, as required by Section 4 of Chapter 62 of the Acts of Assembly 57th Victoria, whereby it appears that the said City Clerk did, under the authority and direction of the said Act of Assembly fix Tuesday the 18th day of September, A. D. 1894, as the day on which the vote referred to in Section 2 of the said Act should be taken, and did thereupon hold polls in the several Wards of the said City as at an election for Mayor, after giving at least ten days' public notice by advertisement of the holding of said polls, and that said vote was taken and all proceedings had as directed by Sections 2 and 3 of said Act, and that the Poll Books and Returns of the Presiding Officers appointed for holding the said polls, were filed with the said City Clerk, as required by the said Section 4 of the said Act of Assembly, and that the result of said voting was that the majority of votes polled on the taking of such votes was in the affirmative;

AND WHEREAS I have this day determined to issue my Proclamation in pursuance of the power given me in that behalf in the said Act.

NOW THEREFORE, I do hereby in and by virtue of the said Act of Assembly 57th Victoria, Chapter 62, proclaim and declare, and hereby give notice, that the result of the voting had and taken under the said Act was in the affirm-

ative, and that the second part of the said Act shall, upon, from and after the 1st day of November, A. D. 1894, become and be in full force and effect.

Notice of Granting Supplementary Letters Patent.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," Supplementary Letters Patent have this day been granted under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the sixteenth day of October, A. D. 1894, whereby the powers of "THE NEW BRUNSWICK ROYAL ART UNION" have been extended for the following purposes:—To buy or subscribe for shares in the stock of any other Company dealing in Art and disseminating and distributing Works of Art, and to give and receive in exchange the shares of the Company for the shares of such other Company; to admit artists to membership in the Art Union Association and to the privileges of the Association, either as Honorary or Associate Members, or otherwise, as may be prescribed by bye law, and with or without liability, and to issue Certificates of Membership under its corporate Seal to such artists, and to regulate, prescribe and determine by bye law the status, rights, privileges, and liabilities of all persons admitted to such membership, in pursuance of the powers in this Section conferred.
