THE attention of all holders of Timber Licenses is called to Section 19 of the Timber Regulations which reads as follows:—

"19. No Spruce or Pine Trees shall be cut by any Licensee under any License, not even for piling, which will not make a log at least 18 feet in length and ten inches at the small end; and if any such shall be cut, the Lumber shall be liable to double Stumpage and the License be forfeited."

And all Licensees are hereby notified that for the future the provisions of this Section will be rigidly enforced.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor in Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of the Act of Assembly fifty sixth Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:—
