IN THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Charles Titus and Gilbert W. Titus, Plaintiffs; and
Michael Cusick, Defendant.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that the above defendant does not reside within the Province, so that he cannot be served with a Summons, and that his place of residence cannot be ascertained by the plaintiffs, and that the above plaintiffs have good *prima facie* grounds for filing a Bill against the above named defendant, and that the defendant is entitled to the equity of redemption of the mortgaged premises, and is a necessary party to this suit. I do hereby order, that the said defendant, on or before the fourteenth day of August next, do enter an appearance in this suit, (if he intend to defend the same), wherein a Bill will be filed against the above named defendant by the above named plaintiffs, for the foreclosure of a mortgage made by said Michael Cusick to the said Charles Titus and Gilbert W. Titus, dated the seventh day of February, A. D. 1895, and for the sale of the mortgaged premises therein described, on which mortgage the plaintiffs claim \$1,400 for the principal and \$865 67 for interest from the date of said mortgage to the date of this Order; and unless such an appearance is so entered the Bill may be taken *pro confesso* and a Decree made.
