WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty fourth day of January next, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the thirty first day of January next, then to meet at Fredericton for the dispatch of business.
