WE, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint Thursday, the twenty-first day of November next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.
