CROWN LAND OFFICE, 20th Mar., 1895.

THE right to cut, raise and carry away Peat Moss or Sphagnum on the following described lands, will be offered for sale at this Office on Wednesday the 17th April next, at 12 o'clock, noon.

Upset price, \$8.00 per square mile, and an annual rental of a like amount, to be paid on the 17th April in each year.

Leases will be granted for ten years, and the first three years to be exempt from any further charge, after which the Government reserves the right to impose a fair amount per ton on the manufactured Moss Litter. Licensees will have one year to commence operations, and if abandoned for one year after beginning operations, the Government will have the right to cancel the Lease.
