IN THE SUPREME COURT IN EQUITY.

Between William Fruing and Company, (Limited), a Corporation duly incorporated under the laws in force in the Island of Jersey, and entitled to sue and liable to be sued, Plaintiffs; and

Xavier Goupie and Margaret Goupie his wife, Laurent Goupie and Marie Goupie his wife, Remi Goupie and Catherine Goupie his wife, Defendants.

WHEREAS it has been made to appear by affidavit to the satisfaction of me, the undersigned, one of the Judges of the Supreme Court, that Xavier Goupie and Margaret Goupie, two of the above defendants, do not reside within the Province, so that they cannot be served with a Summons, and that their place of residence cannot be ascertained by the plaintiffs, and that the above plaintiffs have good *prima facie* grounds for filing a Bill against the above named defendants: I do hereby order, that the said defendants, on or before the thirtieth day of April next, do enter an appearance in this suit, (if they intend to defend the same), wherein a Bill will be filed against the above named defendants by the above named plaintiffs, for the foreclosure of a certain mortgage, and the sale of the mortgaged Land and Premises, which mortgage bears date the thirteenth day of March, A.
