Notice of Granting Letters Patent.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the thirty first day of December, A. D. 1894, incorporating James C. Robertson, of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province aforesaid, Manufacturer; James Mowat, of the same place, Manufacturer; Charles A. Palmer, of the same place, Barrister-

at-Law; Thomas Miller, of the same place, Mill Superintendent, and John D.
