## The Court of Divorce and Matrimonial Causes.

FEBRUARY TERM, A. D. 1895.

WHEREAS by Section fifteen of Chapter 50 of the Consolidated Statutes, intituled 'The Court of Divorce and Matrimonial Causes,' it is provided *inter alia* that the Court shall have power to make Rules and Regulations concerning the practice and procedure in the said Court, and also to alter and revoke some or any of them, as may from time to time be considered necessary.

Now, I, the Honorable James A. VanWart, Judge of Her Majesty's Court of Divorce and Matrimonial Causes, do hereby alter the following Rules, namely:—

Rule 1, promulgated on the 18th day of July, A. D. 1791, to be rescinded, and the following to stand in lieu thereof:—

"That all Citations and other processes be directed either to the party against whom issued, or to the Sheriff of any County in the Province."

The Rule promulgated in October Term, 1871, to be rescinded, and the following to stand in lieu thereof:—

"No cause in which the plaintiff prays for a divorce from the bond of matrimony, shall be entered on the paper for hearing until the Citation with an affidavit of the due service thereof and of a copy of the libel shall have been filed with the Registrar."

Rule 6, promulgated on the 23rd of February, A. D. 1869, to be rescinded.

Rule promulgated in June Term, 1890, intituled "Notice of Trial," to be rescinded.

And I do hereby make the following Rule:—

Fourteen days' notice of trial shall be given in all cases in which defendant appears; and notice of trial may be served at the time of service of the Citation.

### CONTRACT FOR DRIVING.

TENDERS for a Contract for three years for driving the Logs, Timber and Lumber put into the River Saint John and the Aroostook River from the several points below mentioned to the upper limits of the Fredericton Boom Company, at the rates below stated, will be received by the Saint John River Log Driving Company at Saint John, until noon of the 2nd day of April, and at the Queen Hotel in Fredericton, until noon of the 3rd day of April next.

The Tender to state the amount that will be paid by the Tenderer annually for the Contract.

The Contract to contain such clauses and conditions as the Directors may prescribe, to secure the faithful and satisfactory performance of the work.

The rates to be paid per thousand superficial feet of Timber, Logs and Lumber driven to the Fredericton Boom Limits, will be as follows:—

- 1st. From the head of the Grand Falls, 20 cents.
- 2nd. From the mouth of Salmon River, 18 cents.
- 3rd. From the Boundary line on Aroostook River, 20 cents.
- 4th. From the mouth of Tobique River, 16 cents.
- 5th. From the mouth of Big Presque Isle River, 13 cents.
- 6th. From the mouth of the Becagnimac River, 13 cents.
- 7th. From the mouth of the Meduxnickag River, 11 cents.

The Directors are not obliged to accept the highest or any Tender, unless the same shall be satisfactory to them, as to the ability of the party tendering to carry out the Contract, the price offered, and all terms and conditions of the Tender.

The Tenderer must name two bondsmen who are ready to enter into a Bond with him for the sum of Ten thousand dollars for the due performance of the Contract, and the written consent of such persons to enter into the Bond must accompany the Tender.

In case the driving of the Logs, Timber and Lumber be not contracted for upon Tender, the same will be sold at Public Auction, in front of the York County Court House, on Wednesday the 3rd day of April next, at three o'clock, p. m., pursuant to the provisions of Act of Assembly.

Tenders may be addressed to the Secretary at Saint John, or Queen Hotel, Fredericton.
