Notice to Bye-Road Commissioners.

ALL Bye-Road Commissioners are charged with the duty of taking care of the Road Machines in their District, when the working season is over. It is expected of Commissioners that they will see that the machines are cleaned, oiled, and where necessary, painted, and in all cases properly housed and covered for the winter. A small sum will be allowed to cover necessary charges and expenses of such caretaking.

In case the Commissioner fails to comply with this Notice, the Department will have to withdraw the Machine from the District, and place it in charge of officers who will attend to their duty in this regard.
