CONTRACT FOR DRIVING.

TENDERS for a Contract for three years for driving the Logs, Timber and Lumber put into the River Saint John and the Aroostook River from the several points below mentioned to the upper limits of the Fredericton Boom Company, at the rates below stated, will be received by the Saint John River Log Driving Company at Saint John, until noon of the 2nd day of April, and at the Queen Hotel in Fredericton, until noon of the 3rd day of April next.

The Tender to state the amount that will be paid by the Tenderer annually for the Contract.

The Contract to contain such clauses and conditions as the Directors may prescribe, to secure the faithful and satisfactory performance of the work.

The rates to be paid per thousand superficial feet of Timber. Logs and Lumber driven to the Fredericton Boom Limits, will be as follows:—

- 1st. From the head of the Grand Falls, 20 cents.
- 2nd. From the mouth of Salmon River, 18 cents.
- 3rd. From the Boundary line on Aroostook River, 20 cents.
- 4th. From the mouth of Tobique River, 16 cents.
- 5th. From the mouth of Big Presque Isle River, 13 cents.
- 6th. From the mouth of the Becaguimac River, 13 cents.
- 7th. From the mouth of the Meduxnick River, 11 cents.

The Directors are not obliged to accept the highest or any Tender, unless the same shall be satisfactory to them, as to the ability of the party tendering to carry out the Contract, the price offered, and all terms and conditions of the Tender.

The Tenderer must name two bondsmen who are ready to enter into a Bond with him for the sum of Ten thousand dollars for the due performance of the Contract, and the written consent of such persons to enter into the Bond must accompany the Tender.

In case the driving of the Logs, Timber and Lumber be not contracted for upon Tender, the same will be sold at Public Auction, in front of the York County Court House, on WEDNESDAY the 3rd day of April next, at three o'clock, p. m., pursuant to the provisions of Act of Assembly.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Lieutenant Governor in Council for the issue of Letters Patent for incorporation under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," as follows:—

1. The proposed name of the Company is "THE GRODER COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the Company is sought, are—To purchase or otherwise acquire any formulae, proprietary medicines, trade marks, labels or advertisements and rights in connection therewith; to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and hold sufficient real estate for the purposes of the Company, and conduct and carry on the business of manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in any and all kinds of proprietary medicines, and buying, selling, registering and dealing in trade marks, labels and advertisements in connection therewith, or otherwise, with such things as are incident thereto.

3. The Office or principal place of business is to be in Fairville, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

Two hundred of said shares to be preferred stock, and eight hundred of said shares to be ordinary or common stock. Such preferred stock to be preferred over and above the ordinary stock to the full par value thereof, or for such proportion thereof as shall be paid up, but not exceeding the amount so paid up, and all dividends thereon not exceeding six per cent. annually upon the amount paid up thereon; such preferred stock to be known as class "B"

stock, and the ordinary or common stock of the Company to be known as class "A" stock. Such class "B" stock shall be entitled to an annual dividend of six per cent. per annum in preference to and before the payment of any dividends on ordinary stock, and in case of the failure of the Company to pay said dividend on such stock, in whole or in part, in any year, the amount remaining unpaid shall remain a debt of the Company, and shall be paid before any dividend is paid in any subsequent year on the ordinary stock of the Company, and that in any case in distributing the assets or property of the Company, such preferred stock shall rank immediately after the debts and liabilities of the Company to the full par value thereof or to such proportion as shall be paid up thereon, and all dividends thereon then unpaid, and the whole of the balance of the assets of the Company, after paying the said ordinary liabilities of the Company, shall be appropriated towards the payment of the stockholders of the said preferred stock to the full amount of the said stock, or such amount as shall be paid up thereon, and all accumulated dividends aforesaid, previous to the payment of any amount to the holders of the ordinary stock.
