

under this Act, or on behalf of an executor or administrator of the estate of any deceased person duly licensed at the time of his death, during the term of such license.

4. There shall be a board of license commissioners, to be composed of three persons, to be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor, for each City, Town or County, who shall hold office during pleasure; and any two of the said Commissioners shall be a quorum. Before entering upon their office the Commissioners shall be sworn to the faithful and impartial performance of their duties before a Judge of the Supreme Court or a County Court, or some one thereunto authorized by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

#### INSPECTORS OF LICENSES.

5. An Inspector shall be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor from time to time for each City, Town or County, as the Lieutenant-Governor may think fit; and each Inspector shall, before entering upon his duties, give such security as the Provincial Secretary may require for the due performance of his said duties, and for the payment over of all sums of money received by him according to the provisions of this Act; and the salary of every Inspector shall be fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

6. The Inspector shall, unless the Lieutenant-Governor otherwise directs, act as the Secretary of the Board of License Commissioners, and shall visit and inspect all premises for which a license is sought, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Board, or by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council.

#### ISSUE OF LICENSES.

7.—(1) The Lieutenant-Governor in Council may direct the issue of Licenses of the following kinds and descriptions only:

- (a) Tavern Licenses;
- (b) Wholesale Licenses.

Such licenses may be written or printed, or partly written and partly printed, of the several kinds hereinbefore mentioned, and may be in form as in the First Schedule to this Act; and the licenses shall be signed by the Provincial Secretary and dated as of the first day of May in each year, and shall then continue in force for one year, unless forfeited as hereinafter provided, and shall expire on the thirtieth day of April in the next ensuing year.

(2) After the first of May tavern licenses may be issued between the first and fifteenth days of May in each year; and licenses by wholesale may be issued between the first and last days of May in each year; and all such licenses shall be deemed to have been issued on the said first day of May;

(3) Where special grounds are shown, the License Commissioners may direct one or more licenses to issue at any time after the said first day of May, if within the limit authorized by this Act; provided, always, that the petition or application therefor shall have been filed with the Inspector thirty days before the granting thereof.

8. Every license shall be issued, under the direction of the respective Boards of License Commissioners, by the Inspector for the License District in which the tavern, warehouse, or other place to which the license is to apply, is situate.

9. No license shall be issued for the sale of liquor on any vessel navigating any of the inland waters of the Province of New Brunswick, nor shall any liquor be sold or kept for sale in any room or place on any such vessel.

10.—(1) A tavern license shall authorize the licensee to sell, traffic and barter by retail in fermented, spirituous or malt liquors in quantities not exceeding one quart, which may be drunk in the hotel, saloon or tavern or other house of entertainment in which the same is sold;
