PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the twenty-third day of April instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday the twenty-eighth day of May next.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty-second day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the fifty-ninth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

LIQUOR LICENSE ACT, 1896.

AT a meeting of the Board of License Commissioners for the License District of Restigouche County, held on the twenty-eighth day of April, A. D. 1896, the following Resolutions were passed for the regulating of Tavern Licenses, agreeable to the provisions of Section 22 of the said Act, which empowers the Board of License Commissioners to make regulations and impose penalties for the infraction thereof:—

RESOLVED, That all Licensed Taverns within the License District of Restigouche County shall be closed, and all lights therein extinguished, and no liquor sold, between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock on Saturday, and between six o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock at night on other week days. That no sale or other disposal of liquor shall take place in any retail bar or room or place defined in the license, or on the premises thereof, or out of or from the same, or on, out of or from any premises communicating therewith, to any person or persons whomsoever, from or after the hour of ten o'clock at night on all week days (except Saturday) till six o'clock on the following morning.

RESOLVED, That all places where intoxicating liquors are or may be sold by wholesale within the License District of Restigouche County, the warehouse or store or place defined in the license, shall be closed and all lights therein extinguished on all week days (except Saturday) at ten o'clock at night; and the same shall remain closed until six o'clock on the following morning. That no sale or other disposal of liquor shall take place in any such wholesale warehouse, or store, or shop or place defined in the license, or on the premises thereof, or out of or from the same, or on, or out of, or from any premises communicating therewith, to any person or persons whomsoever, from or after the hour of ten o'clock at night on all week days (except Saturdays) till six o'clock on the following morning.

RESOLVED, That any Licensee, or his employee, or other person acting for him, being charged with violating the provisions of this Regulation, consisting of the foregoing Resolutions, shall, on conviction, be liable for the first offence, to a penalty of not less than Thirty dollars nor more than Fifty dollars; for a second offence, to a penalty of not less than Fifty dollars, nor more than Seventy dollars; and for a third offence, to a penalty of not less than Seventy dollars, nor more than One hundred dollars; and in default of payment of such fine and costs, may be imprisoned in the Common Gaol of the said County for any period not exceeding three months.
