### NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-eighth day May, A. D. 1896, incorporating John A. Nadeau, of the Town of Fort Kent, in the State of Maine, one of the United States of America, Customs Officer; George V. Cunliffe, of the same place, Merchant; Joseph A. Laliberte, of the same place, Merchant; Felix G. Sirois, of the same place, Doctor of Medicine; Henry W. Nadeau, of the same place, Merchant; Frank W. Mallet, of the same place, Merchant; Silas Niles, of the same place, Merchant; Asa M. Pinkham, of the same place, Farmer; A. G. Fenlason, of the same place, Counsellor-at-Law; Joseph Long, of Middle Saint Francis, in the County of Madawaska, in the Province of New Brunswick, Tavern-Keeper; Michel Michand, of Frenchville, in the said State of Maine, Merchant; T. Medley Richards, of Edmundston, in the said County of Madawaska, Merchant; and Thomas J. Cochrane, of the same place, Bank Agent; for the following purposes, viz:—To erect, maintain and operate a system of Telephone throughout and anywhere in the County of Madawaska, and from any point in the said County of Madawaska to the centre of the River Saint John, where the said River Saint John is the boundary between the said County of Madawaska and the said State of Maine, and there to connect their telephone system with any telephone line existing in the said State of Maine, and also to connect their telephone system at any point in the County of Madawaska with any other

telephone line existing or operated outside of the said County of Madawaska; and for such purpose by their agents, servants and workmen to have and to exercise (subject to such restrictions as the Lieutenant Governor in Council may impose and direct) all such rights, privileges and franchises as may be necessary for making, completing, supporting, using, operating and maintaining such system of communicating by telephone between said points; to enter into any arrangements for such purpose with any person or Company possessing any line of telephone, telegraph, or any other power or right to use communication by means of the telephone or telegraph between said points, upon such terms and in such manner as the Board of Directors of said Company may from time to time decide upon, without in any way contravening or interfering with any of the exclusive rights conferred upon "The New Brunswick Telephone Company, (Limited);" and for such other powers, privileges and franchises as may be necessary to carry out the objects of the said Company, subject to certain conditions in the Letters Patent more particularly defined; by the name of "THE MADAWASKA TELEPHONE COMPANY, (Limited);" with a total Capital of Five thousand dollars, divided into two hundred shares of Twenty-five dollars each.
