NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor in Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name of and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "THE SAINT JOHN ROLLING MILLS AND BOLT WORKS COMPANY, (Limited)."
