## GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

THE ATTENTION of CARRIAGE MANUFACTURERS and of the  
Public generally, is invited to the following provision contained  
in "The Highways Act, 1896" :-

### Wide Tires on certain Vehicles.

"(2) On and after the first day of May, in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, the wheels of every  
vehicle loaded with stone, gravel, sand, or other material of any  
kind or nature whatsoever, when the load exceeds in weight one  
and a half tons, shall, when used and passing over or along any  
Highway, be provided with tires not less than four inches wide;  
the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle, shall, for every  
offence against this Section, incur a penalty of five dollars."

Preparation should be made by all interested, so as to conform  
to the requirements of this enactment.

## NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE is hereby given, That application will be made by the  
applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Gov-  
ernor in Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal,  
according to the provision of the Act of the General Assembly  
56th Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "The New Brunswick Joint  
Stock Companies' Act, 1893," incorporating the applicants and  
such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed  
Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for  
the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The name of the Company is to be "THE COLDBROOK IRON  
AND STEEL COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are :-

(a.) To acquire by purchase or otherwise that piece or parcel of  
land and premises situate, lying and being in the Parish of Simonds,  
in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Bruns-  
wick, and known as The Coldbrook Rolling Mills, with their and  
every of their appurtenances, and all the buildings, mill property,  
machinery and plant thereon situate, and to acquire by purchase,  
or otherwise, other lands and premises, buildings, mills, ware-  
houses and premises in the Province of New Brunswick, for the  
purpose of maintaining, managing, working and operating a Roll-  
ing Mill, and to lease, mortgage, sell, dispose of, or otherwise deal  
with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

(b.) To acquire by purchase, or otherwise, scrap iron, puddle  
bar, steel billet, fire brick, coal, sand, clay, furnaces, plant, machi-  
nery, and other personal property and materials that are necessary  
for the proper working, maintaining, operating and running of a  
Rolling Mill as may seem directly or indirectly conducive to or  
expedient and useful for any of the purposes of the Company, and  
to sell and dispose of the same or any part of the same.

(c.) To make, construct, carry on, maintain, manage, work,  
control and superintend a Rolling Mill, warehouses, furnaces,  
plant, machinery, bridges, walls, reservoirs, watercourses, aque-  
ducts, sawmills, hydraulic works, telephones, and to manufacture  
bar iron, steel bar, nail plate, railroad spikes, ship spikes, and  
generally all kinds of merchantable iron which may seem con-  
ducive to or expedient and useful for any of the purposes of the  
Company, and to sell and dispose of the same or any of the same.

(d.) To use steam, water, electricity, or any other power as a  
motive power, or otherwise.

(e.) To enter into any agreement for sharing profits, union of  
interests, or co-operation with any person or Company carrying  
on or about to carry on any business or transaction capable of  
being conducted so as to benefit the said Company.

(f.) To pay out of the funds of the Company all expenses of or  
incidental to the formation, registration and advertising of the  
Company, and remunerate any person or Company for services  
rendered, or to be rendered, in placing of the shares in the Com-  
pany's capital, or any debenture or other securities of the Com-  
pany, or in or about the formation or promotion of the Company,  
or the conduct of its business.

(g.) To improve, manage, develop, lease, mortgage, sell, dispose  
of, or otherwise deal with all or any parts of the property and  
rights of the Company.

3. The operations of the Company are to be carried on in the  
Province of New Brunswick, and the Office or chief place of busi-  
ness of the Company is to be established at Coldbrook in the  
Parish of Simonds, in the City and County of Saint John, in said  
Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of said Company is to be  
Twenty thousand dollars, divided into four hundred shares of  
Fifty dollars each, of which ten thousand shares are actually  
subscribed.
