ASSEMBLY CHAMBER.

FREDERICTON, SATURDAY, March 13, 1897.

This day, at seven o'clock, p. m., His Honor the Honorable Abner Reid McClelan, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Assembly Chamber, and being seated on the Throne, after assenting to the several Bills passed during the Session, was pleased to close the Session with the following

SPEECH:
