NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT.

NOTICE is hereby given, That application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, in accordance with the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The name of the Company is to be "KING LUMBER COMPANY, (Limited)."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—

(a.) To carry on the general lumber business in all its branches, including the logging, driving, sawing, manufacturing and shipping of lumber of every nature, kind and description, and the buying, selling and otherwise dealing in the same, manufactured and unmanufactured; to operate saw mills for the sawing and manufacturing of lumber; and to carry on a general store business.
