WE, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Ourpeople throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint THURSDAY, the twenty-fifth day of NOVEMBER next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

In Testimony Whereof. We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness, Our Trusty and Well-beloved General Alexander George Montgomery-Moore, Administrator of the Government of Canada, and Commander of Our Forces therein, etc., etc.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this TWEN-TIETH day of OCTOBER, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the sixtyfirst year of Our Reign.
