this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout
Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be here-
unto affixed. WITNESS, Our Trusty and Well-beloved
General Alexander George Montgomery-Moore, Adminis-
trator of the Government of Canada, and Commander of
Our Forces therein, etc., etc.

TIETH day of OCTOBER, in the year of Our Lord one
