Now Know YE, that We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, have thought fit to appoint, and do appoint TUESDAY, the TWENTY-SECOND day of JUNE, A. D. 1897, to be observed throughout Our Dominion as a day of general thanksgiving and rejoicing on the occasion of Our Diamond Jubilee.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-Beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honorable Sir John Campbell Hamilton-Gordon, Earl of Aberdeen; Viscount Formartine, Baron Haddo, Methlic, Tarves and Keilie, in the Peerage of Scotland; Viscount Gordon of Aberdeen, County of Aberdeen, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Baronet of Nova Scotia, Knight Grand Cross of of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, etc., etc., Governor General of Canada.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed.
