GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

The Lieutenant-Governor in Council has made and declared the following Regulation of the Provincial Board of Health, which reads as follows:—

"It is hereby Ordered, That Puerperal fever be and the same is hereby declared to be an infectious disease, and all Regulations of the Provincial Board of Health relating to epidemic, endemic and contagious diseases, and the prevention thereof, shall apply to and include cases of Puerperal fever, in so far as the same may be made applicable thereto,"

to be observed and executed by all health officers of the Provincial and Local Boards of Health.
