WE, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint Thursday, the twenty-fourth day of November next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. WITNESS, Our Right Trusty and Right Well-beloved Cousin and Councillor the Right Honourable Sir JOHN CAMPBELL HAMILTON-GORDON, Earl of Aberdeen; Viscount Formartine, Baron Haddo, Methlic, Tarves and Kellie, in the Peerage of Scotland; Viscount Gordon of Aberdeen, County of Aberdeen, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Baronet of Nova Scotia; Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, &c., &c., Governor General of Canada.

## Rules and Practice of the House of Assembly.

### PRIVATE BILLS.

At the last Session of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, Rule 78 was repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

"78.—(1) No Private Bill shall be received by this House after the tenth day from the opening of the Session, both inclusive,

(2) A typewritten or printed copy of every Private Bill so to be introduced shall be filed with the Clerk of the House at least three days before the opening of the Session; and in case of failure to comply with this provision, the fee on the introduction of any such Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule 84, applicable to such Bill."
