WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Province stands
prorogued to Thursday the thirtieth day of June in-
stant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said General
Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to
Thursday the fourth day of August next.

AT THE COURT AT WINDSOR,
The 19th day of May, 1898.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 238, of "The Merchant
Shipping Act, 1894," it is provided that, where it appears to Her
Majesty that due facilities are, or will be, given by the Government
of any foreign country for recovering and apprehending seamen
who desert from British merchant ships in that country, Her
Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are
or will be given, declare that that section shall apply in the case
of such foreign country, subject to any limitations, conditions,
and qualifications contained in the Order:

And whereas it appears to Her Majesty that due facilities are
given by the Government of Japan for recovering and appre-
hending seamen who desert from British merchant-ships in that
country:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice
of Her Privy Council, on the 3rd day of February, 1898, to pass
a PROVISIONAL Order applying section 238 of "The Merchant Ship-
ping Act, 1894," in the case of Japan:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of "The Rules Publica-
tion Act, 1893," have been complied with:

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested
in Her by the herein-before recited sub-section (1) of section 238
of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," and by and with the
advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and
it is hereby ordered and declared, that the said section 238 of "The
Merchant Shipping Act, 1894," shall apply in the case of Japan.

And the Secretary of State for the Home Department, the
Secretary of State for the Colonies, and the Secretary of State for
India in Council, are to give the necessary directions herein
accordingly.
