PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, That under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1893," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of November, 1898, incorporating John Kilburn, Lumberman; Willard Kitchen. Merchant; John Palmer, Tanner; Edward Moore, Yeoman; Odbur M. Hartt, Sheo Manufacturer; W. Turney Whitehead, Land Agent; James S. Neill, Merchant; James W. McCready, Barrister; John Black, Barrister; all of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; and George J. Rules and Practice of the House of Assembly. PRIVATE BILLS

At the last Session of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick, Rule 78 was repealed, and the following sub-

"78.—(1) No Private Bill shall be received by this House after the tenth day from the opening of the Session, both inclusive,

(2) A typewritten or printed copy of every Private Bill so to be introduced shall be filed with the Clerk of the House at least three days before the opening of the Session; and in case of failure to comply with this provision, the fee on the introduction of any such Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule 84, applicable to such Bill."
