GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

THE ATTENTION of CARBIAGE MANUFACTURERS and of the Public generally, is invited to the following provision contained in "The Highways Act, 1896" :--

Wide Tires on certain Vehicles.

"(2) On and after the first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, the wheels of every vehicle loaded with stone, gravel, sand, or other material of any kind or nature whatsoever, when the load exceeds in weight one and a half tons, shall, when used and passing over or along any Highway, be provided with tires not less than four inches wide; the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle, shall, for every offence against this Section, incur a penalty of five dollars." Preparation should be made by all interested, so as to conform to the requirements of this enactment.
