## CAP. XII.

An Act to further amend Chapter 60 of the Consolidated Statutes, of 'Justices' Civil Courts.'

Repeal of Sec. 13, Cap. 60, Cons. Stat. and new Section substituted;
Arrest and bail.

Passed 18th March, 1898.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative
Assembly as follows:

Section 13 of Chapter 60 of the Consolidated Statutes, intituled 'Justices' Civil Courts,' is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

"13. After the defendant is arrested, the constable shall take bail for his appearance, who shall subscribe a memorandum endorsed on the capias, that they have become so. But if no bail be offered, he shall carry the defendant before the Justice who issued the capias, or before some other Justice of the County resident near the place where the defendant has been arrested, and the defendant, when brought there shall either deposit (D) with the constable, the sum sworn to and costs, or give bail in the manner aforesaid, or be committed to gaol by warrant (E) of the Justice. The deposit shall be applied to the payment of the plaintiff's judgment, and if there be an overplus, it shall be returned to the defendant on demand. The plaintiff may at any time waive bail, and proceed as on summons.

## CAP. XXX.

An Act to amend the Law relating to Rates and Taxes throughout the Province.

Sec.
1 Person visiting a City, Town or Parish for temporary purpose, not liable to assessment as inhabitants.

Sec.
2 "Literary Institution," meaning of for the purpose of assessment.

Passed 18th March, 1898.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Assembly as follows:

- 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any Act heretofore passed, no person shall be liable to be assessed as an inhabitant of any City, Town or Parish upon personal property or income, merely by reason of his visiting such City, Town or Parish for a temporary purpose, though such visit may be connected with business.
- 2. In the construction of all Acts relating to assessment of rates and taxes applying to any City, Town or Municipality throughout the Province, the term "literary institution" shall include law societies, medical societies, and associations formed for the advancement of science or art within the Province.
