## PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Robert Randolph Call, Esquire, High Sheriff of the County of Northumberland, has made a Return to the Honorable the Provincial Secretary, setting forth that an Election of the Ratepayers of the Town of Newcastle, in the said County of Northumberland, was held at Newcastle aforesaid on the fifteenth day of June instant, to determine whether the inhabitants thereof should become incorporated under the provisions of The Towns Incorporation Act of 1896.

That at such Election there were 329 votes cast; 246 of the ballots being marked "For," and 83 of the ballots were marked "Against."

That the Boundaries of the said Town are as follows:

"On the North by a Road commonly called the Cross Road, being "at or near the rear line of the first concession of lots; on the South "by the middle of the Miramichi River; on the East by French Fort "Cove and the brook emptying into same; and on the West by the Jones' Cove and Cruden Brook."

And it appearing by said Return that a majority of the Ratepayers of said Town have voted in favor of incorporation;

I do therefore proclaim that the said Town of Newcastle, comprised within the boundaries hereinbefore described, be incorporated under and by virtue of the provisions of The Towns Incorporation Act,
